## Get ready to catch *Archive Fever!* at The Clay & Glass

WATERLOO (ONTARIO) CANADA • September 10, 2014: The Canadian Clay and Glass Gallery is pleased to present the newest exhibition, *Archive Fever!*, which is guest curated by Krista Blake.

An opening reception will be held at the Gallery on Sunday, September 14, 2014 from 2 to 5 pm with remarks at 2:30 pm.

Playing with the concepts of storing, collecting, and conserving information; *Archive Fever!* is an evolving public repository that allows intimate interaction with some of today's most innovative and creative thinkers.

"*Archive Fever!* is a conceptually brilliant exhibition that invites the public to peer inside the hearts and minds of some of the world's leading artists and innovators." notes Christian Bernard Singer, Curator of the Gallery. "Krista Blake proposes exciting new ways of interacting with the public while challenging traditional definitions of what a ceramics and glass exhibition should be."
