Presented annually, the John and Barbara Mather Award for Lifetime Achievement is awarded to an individual or group who "displayed exceptional commitment to the further development of craft in Ontario and throughout Canada." Award recipients are truly outstanding members of Ontario's craft community who have supported the furthering of craft arts. This award is "one of the highest markers of exceptional commitment to the development of craft in Ontario.

As Emma Quin, Executive Director of the Textile Museum of Canada, stated in her nomination statement, "Dr. Denis Longchamps has been a supporter and collector of craft since his early 20's ... Through his 20+ year career supporting and advocating for craft, Denis has been unwavering in his commitment." Quin continues, "Throughout his curatorial work, teaching, writing, advocating, and mentorship, he has made outstanding contributions to Ontario and Canada's craft scene, contributions that deserve significant recognition."
