## 2022 RBC Award for Glass Finalists Announced!

WATERLOO (ONTARIO) CANADA, March 14, 2022: The Canadian Clay & Glass Gallery is excited to announce the **finalists for the 2022 RBC Award for Glass!** This year's finalists are: **Charlie Larouche-Potvin** (Montréal, QC), **Jared Last** (Revelstoke, BC), **Jeanne Létourneau** (Montréal, QC), and **Jérémie St-Onge** (Montréal, QC).

Finalists will be included in an **exhibition at the Canadian Clay & Glass Gallery** in Fall 2022, along with the winner and finalists of the Winifred Shantz Award for Ceramics. Next week, we will announce the RBC Award for Glass winner, who will receive a prize of **\$10,000** to undertake research, residencies, or creative exploration to advance their artistic and professional practice at a critical point in their career. In addition, the remaining **finalists will receive a \$1,000 award** to support the development of their practice. The exhibition will provide a rare opportunity for these emerging makers to share their work with an extensive audience while helping to build their careers.

Executive Director & Chief Curator Denis Longchamps states: "The calibre of submissions for the award this year was phenomenal, and our jurors faced a difficult task in selecting the finalists. These finalists, and all artists who submitted, demonstrate the strength of emerging talent in glass art in Canada and the need for this award to recognize and support artists at this critical point in their careers. We are grateful for the support of the RBC Foundation for this award and look forward to announcing the winner of the RBC Award for Glass."

The 2022 RBC Award for Glass was juried by **Laura Donefer**, **Dr. Juliette MacDonald**, and **Julia Reimer**.

Up to five finalists will each receive a \$1,000 award to support the development of their careers.
